ReWa in the Community:



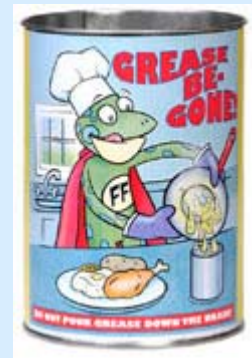
