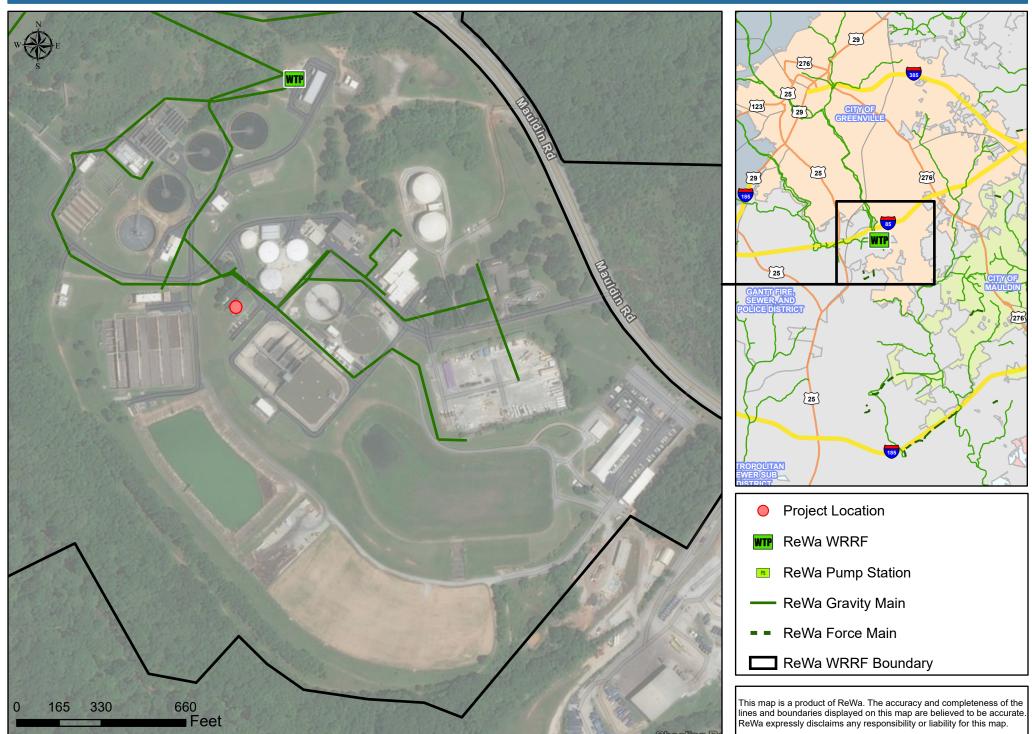

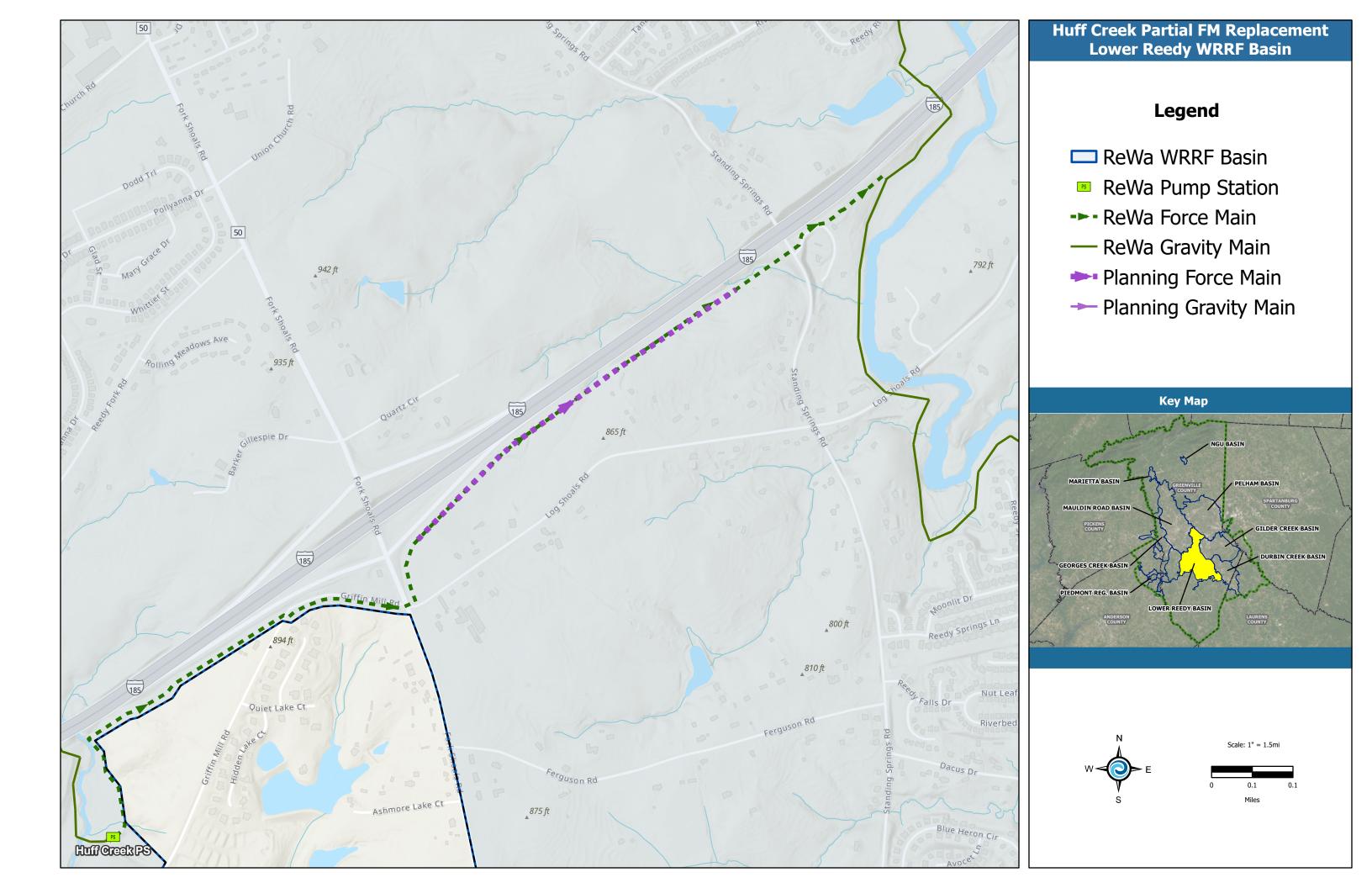
BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS' MEMORANDUM

The Huff Creek Force Main is a 16" PVC force main that has experienced numerous breaks since it's installation in 2004. ReWa replaced several problematic sections with DIP in 2011. Since 2020, ReWa has experienced four breaks on a portion of the main that was not replaced with DIP yet. Staff has negotiated a CMAR construction contract with Garney Companies, Inc. to replace this 2300 LF section with DIP.

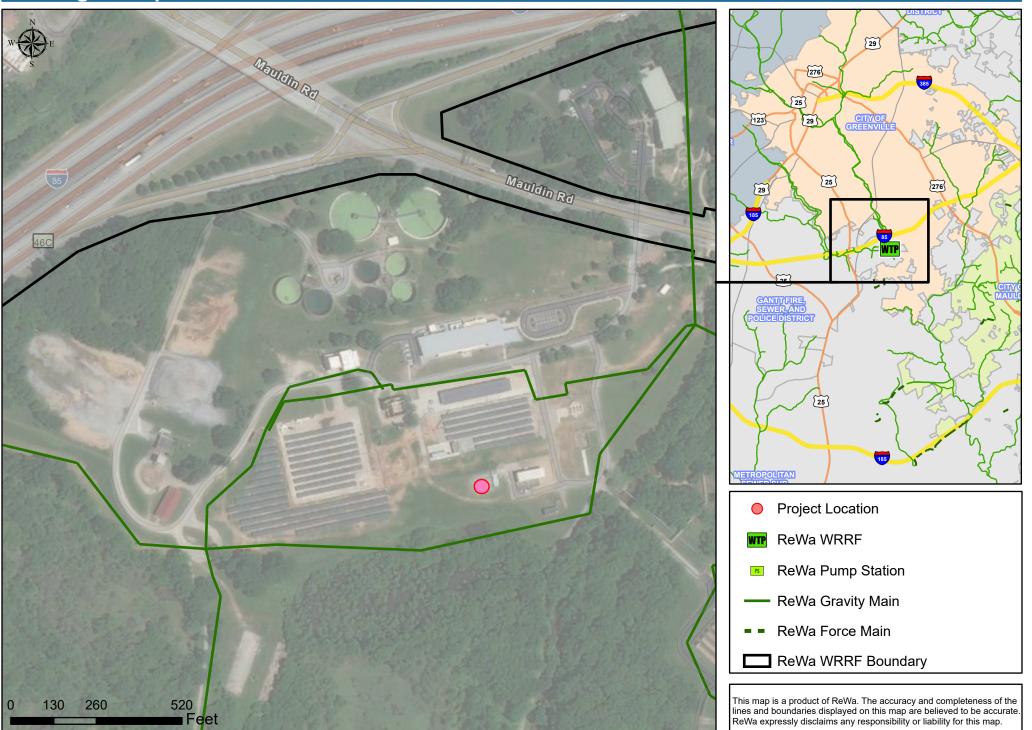
Due to downstream electrical improvements, the existing Mauldin Road WRRF main electrical switchgear, installed in the 1960s, has reached the end of its useful life. The existing switchgear will be removed in its entirety and replaced with new switchgear contained in a walk-in enclosure in the vicinity of the existing switchgear with access elevated above the 500-year flood event. Staff recommends commencing with construction of the switchgear replacement.

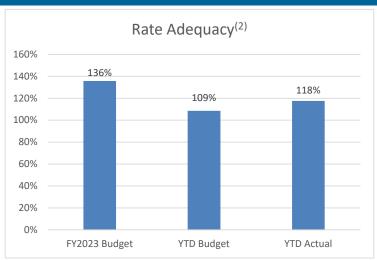

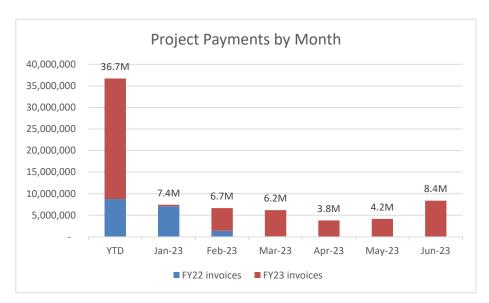

SUBJECT: Affordable Housing New Account Fee

Program Update



BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS' MEMORANDUM

Through discussions with the Greenville County Redevelopment Authority, Staff identified an opportunity to provide additional affordable housing assistance to qualifying households by expanding ReWa's Affordable Housing New Account Fee Program to include 50% reimbursement of our New Account Fee on required septic to sewer conversions.

Staff recommends the Board approve the proposed revisions to the Affordable Housing New Account Fee Program.

Renewable Water Resources Affordable Housing New Account Fee Program

ReWa recognizes the need for affordable wastewater capacity fees while assuring that wastewater infrastructure is available to foster economic development in our service area.

After appropriate investigation, ReWa has determined to provide assistance for qualifying affordable housing for the payment of new account fees through the Affordable Housing New Account Fee Program (the "Program"). The Program will further the public purpose of ReWa in providing sewer services to its customers.

Each year during its budgeting process, ReWa will determine whether to appropriate a certain sum (the "*Grant Funds*") from its revenues to fund the Program. The Grant Funds will be used to fund 50% of the new account fee to qualifying affordable housing.

ReWa will determine on an annual basis whether or not to fund the Program and, if to fund the Program, the amount to be funded. ReWa is not obligated to provide the Grant Funds in every fiscal year. If ReWa determines not to provide the Grant Funds for a particular fiscal year, the decision not to fund does not preclude ReWa from providing Grant Funds in subsequent fiscal years.

The Program will apply to new housing units that ReWa has received written certification by either the Greenville County Redevelopment Authority or the Community Development Division of the City of Greenville that such housing units are designated affordable housing. The Program will also apply to required septic to sewer conversions for qualifying households as certified by Greenville County Redevelopment Authority.

Annually, ReWa would notify these agencies the amount of, if any, approved Grant Funds available. The Grant Funds should be utilized to reimburse new account fees previously paid provided the

- 1. housing units meet the requirements of this Program and are approved certified by either the Greenville County Redevelopment Authority or the Community Development Division of the City of Greenville based on the Development Project Closing Checklist, or
- household meets the requirements of the Program and are certified by the Greenville County Redevelopment Authority based on the Septic to Sewer Form.
