The scope also includes replacement of the headworks hydraulic actuation system, including installation of updated electrical and control systems and fourteen new actuators.

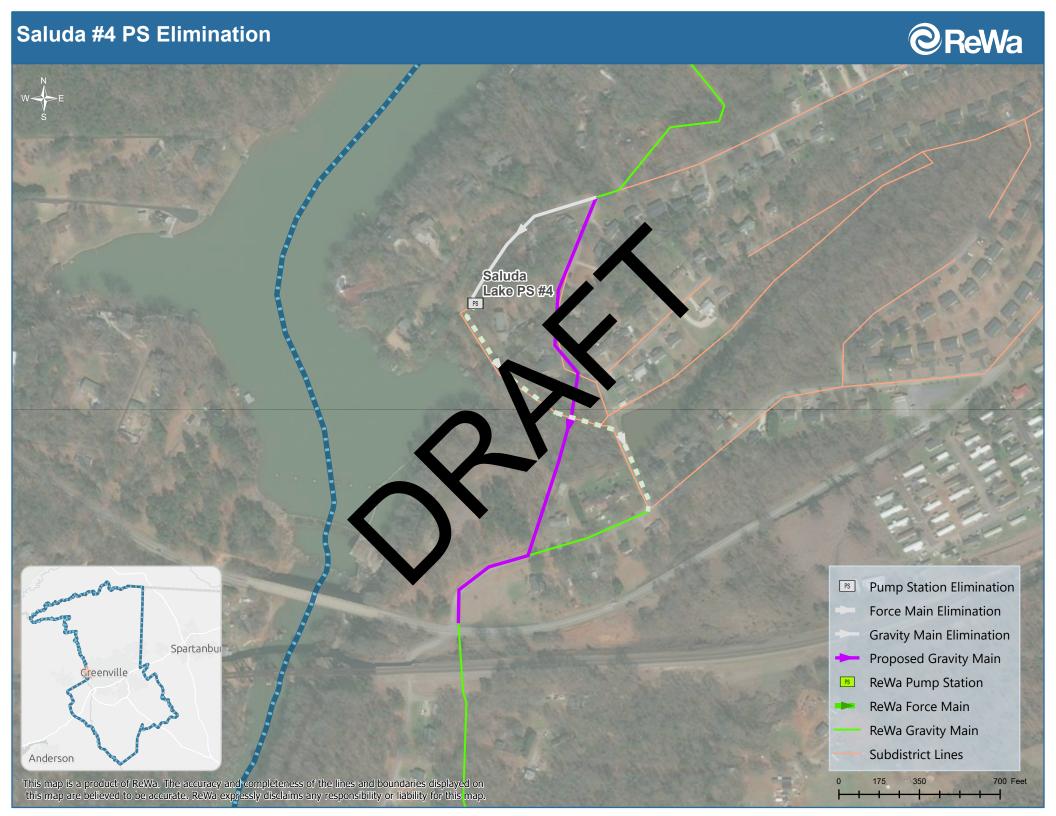

The Mauldin Road Solar Dryer Project consists of the installation of six (6) solar dryer cells located on the southern portion of the site. ReWa advertised a Request for Proposal (RFP) from Construction Firms in May 2023 for Construction Manager at Risk (CMAR) Services. Qualifications were received from six (6) construction firms. The ReWa selection committee reviewed the written qualifications and scored each firm's proposal against the scoring matrix provided in the RFP. The two (2) highest scoring firms were shortlisted for interviews on the Project:

- Harper Corporation
- State Utility Contractors, Inc.

Interviews were held with both firms on August 3, 2.2. Based upon the proposals received and subsequent interviews with the shortlisted firm staff has determined that Harper Corporation is the most qualified CMAR firm to purish construction services for the Project.

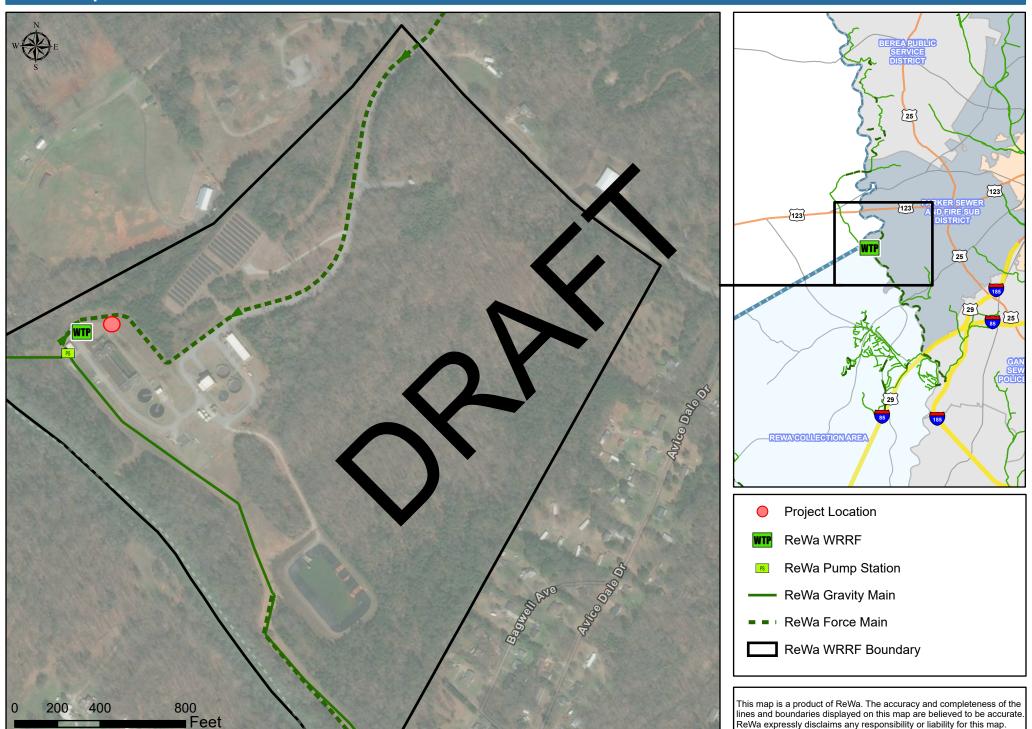

### Enoree River Gravity Sewer Upgrade Right of Way Acquisition

WHEREAS, the Enoree River Gravity Sewer Upgrade Project consists of upgrading approximately 3 miles of gravity sewer roughly adjacent to the Enoree River from Wade Hampton Boulevard to Corey Burns Park in Taylors; and

WHEREAS, Staff and Renewable Water Resource's (ReWa) consulting engineer, Hazen and Sawyer, have determined it is necessary to acquire right of way either by way of gift, purchase, or by the exercise of eminent domain in accordance with ReWa procedures;

WHEREAS, ReWa is a body politic under the law of it. State of South Carolina and has rights under the Eminent Domain Procedure Act;

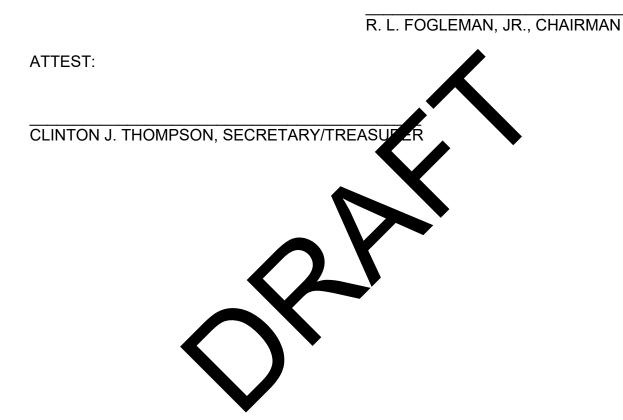
NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED at the Chief Executive Officer and/or his designee are directed to proceed with this project a cacquire through gift, purchase, or by exercise of eminent domain, rights of way and/or lane over properties needed to construct, operate, and maintain the proposed infrastructure. This authority is to include, but not be limited to, the institution of any and all other actions reasonably associated with acquiring the necessary rights of way for construction.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED the event the rights of way cannot be acquired by gift or purchase, the Chief Execut. Officer and/or his designee shall cause to be instituted condemnation proceedings to verce ReWa's right of eminent domain under the provisions of S.C. Code Ann. Section 28-2-1t. et say. by way of trial as set forth in S.C. Code Ann. Section 28-2-240, as amended.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Chief Executive Officer and/or his designee are authorized to negotiate special terms and conditions with property owners as part of such acquisition, where appropriate, which are not inconsistent with the needs of ReWa.

BE IT RESOLVED that should any lien holder, existing or otherwise, attempt to take any action or make any claims which would interfere with ReWa's right to construct, operate and maintain the Project, ReWa has rights under the law to counteract such interference, including the Right of Eminent Domain, pursuant to Title 28, Chapter 2 of the Code of Laws of South Carolina 1976, as amended, including Section 28-2-90, and ReWa affirms that it will take any such action necessary to counteract such interference.

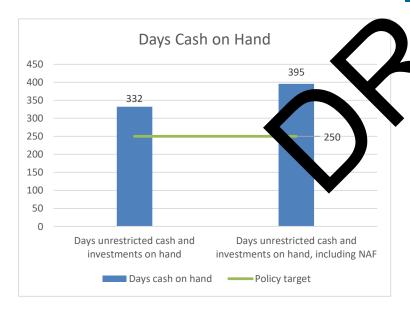


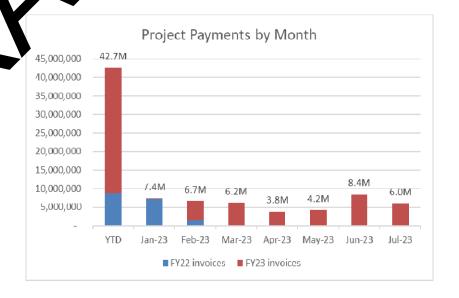
(1)Percentage of revenue after operating expense to cover long term debt payments
