




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ReWa 2023 Compliance Metrics





- ReWa's lab is certified by DHEC's laborat exertification program to perform 21 different analytical methods.
- The laboratory supports compliance, operations, industrial pretreatment, biosolids, engineering, and collections teams. The lab also supports ReWa's research and process improvement efforts.






- A team of 4 pretreatment coordinarys perform inspections of ReWa's industrial dischargers, commercial users, and food service establishments.

2022 Development Metrics




