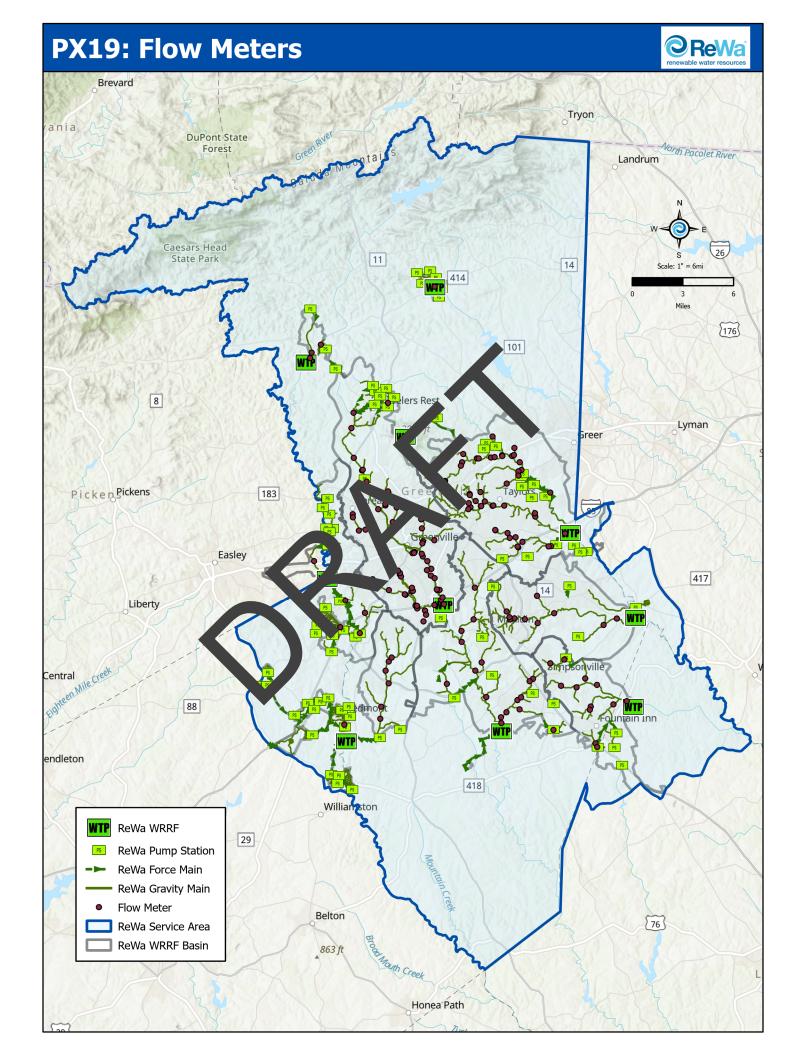
BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS' MEMORANDUM

As part of the IDC contract awarded to CHA Companies for flow monitoring services, Staff has negotiated a Scope of Work for the remainder of the 2023 budget year.

These services include the operation and maintenance of 144 permanent ReWa-owned flow meters and 31 temporary meters for the Wet Weather Program data analysis, and equipment repair and replacement. This contract also includes the pure ase of 20 new flow meters, half of which will be used to build the flow meter network in A decon County while the other half will be to replace meters reaching the end of their useful life. Stan recommends continued use of CHA Companies to perform flow monitoring services.

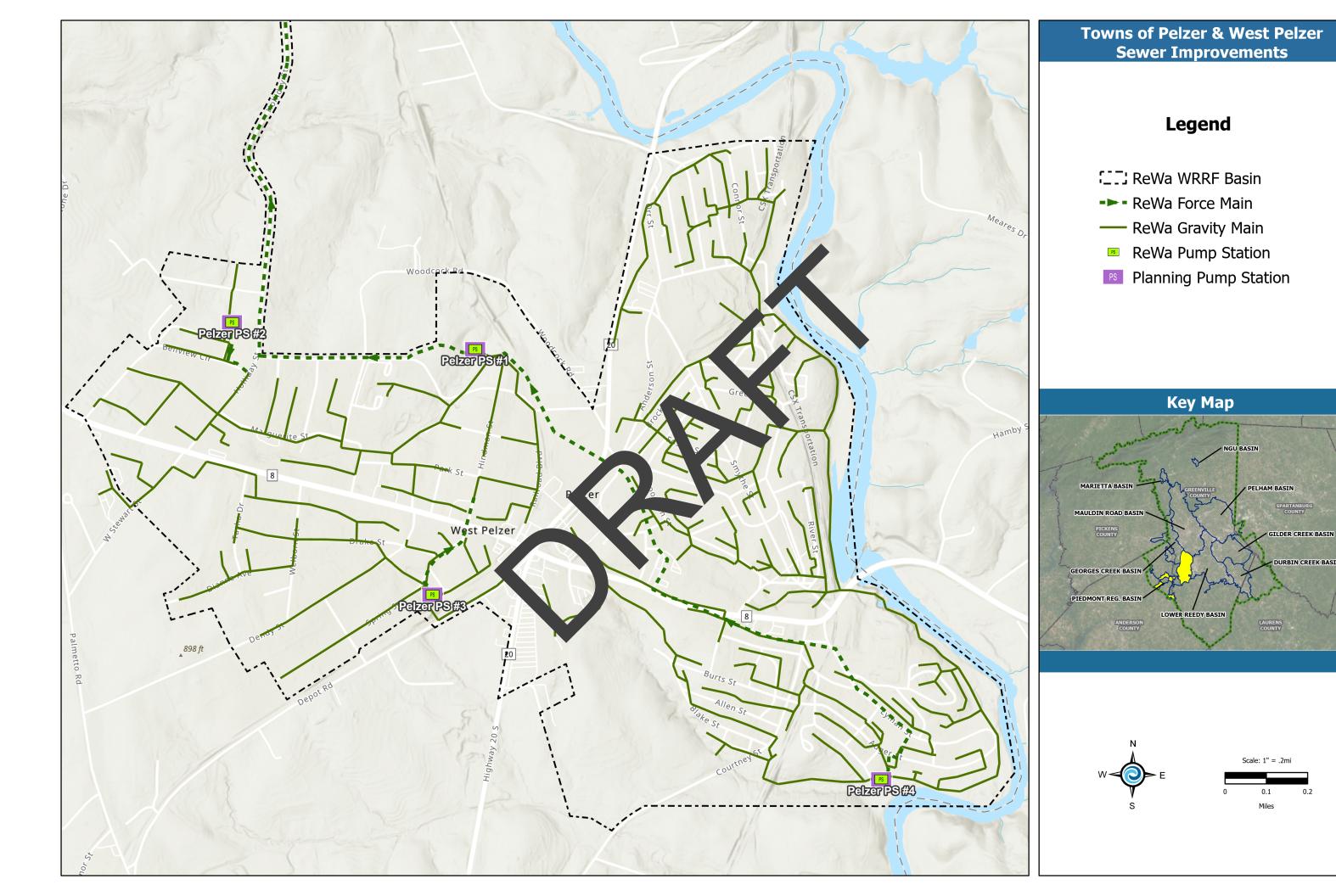

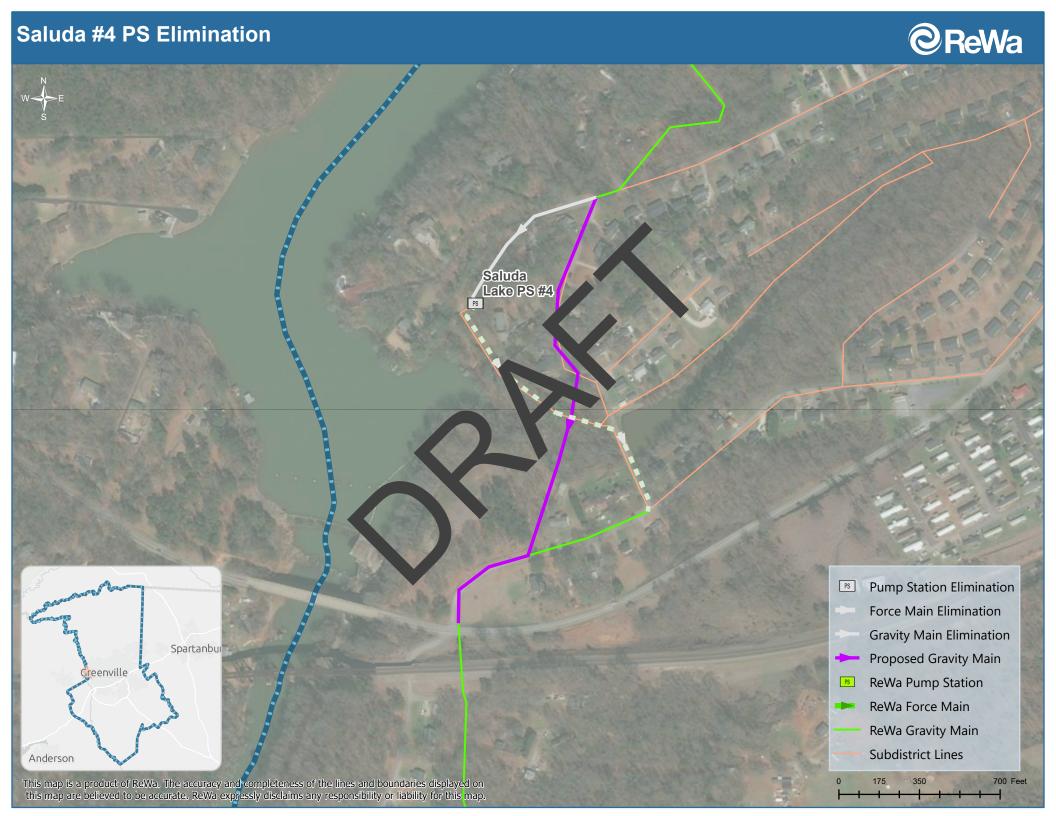

The Saluda #4 Pump Station Elimination project is currently under construction by Tugaloo Pipeline, Inc. A contract amendment is needed to address additional work items not included in the original construction award due to unforeseen conditions from significant subsurface rock near the Saluda Lake Dam. To protect the integrity of the dam, a modification in rock removal methods is required. Staff has negotiated a contract amendment to address these additional work items.

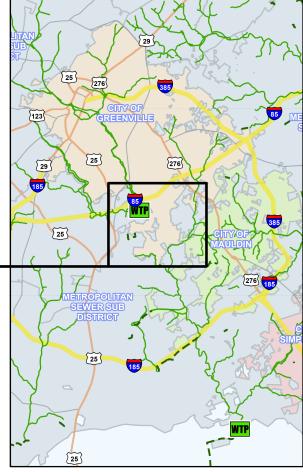

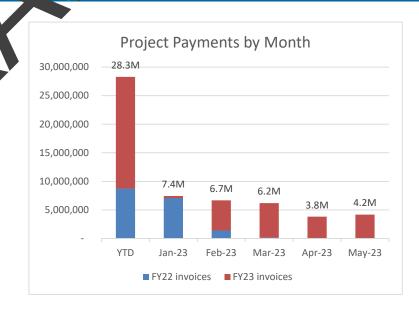
