In accordance with section 4-104 of ReWa's Procurement Code, ReWa advertised a Request for Proposal (RFP) from Construction Firms in December 2022 for the Construction Manager at Risk (CMAR) Services on the Enoree River Improvement Project. Qualifications were received from 5 Construction Firms for the project. The ReWa selection committee reviewed the written qualifications that were received and scored each Firm's proposal against the scoring matrix provided in the RFP. The following three (3) Firms were the highest scoring Firms from the written RFP review and therefore were shortlisted for interview on the Project:

- Garney Companies, Inc.
- JDS, Inc.
- Reeves Young, LLC

Additional project specific information was requested of each shortlisted Firm and interviews were held with all three (3) Firms on February 28, 2023. The ReWa selection committee reviewed the project specific information submitted by each of the Firms and scored each Firm's interview session against the scoring matrix provided in the RFP. Based upon the cumulative scores from both the Written RFP and the Interview portions of the selection process, staff has determined that Garney Companies, Inc. is the most qualified CMAR Firm to provide construction services for the Project.

Staff recommends that the Board award CMAR Pipeline Construction Services for the Enoree River Improvement Project to Garney Companies, Inc. and authorize the Chief Executive Officer to execute CMAR Preconstruction Services for this project in the not to exceed amount of \$50,000.

SUBJECT: CMAR Services Pipeline Construction Award – Swamp Rabbit Trail Phase 1 and 2 Improvement Project

In accordance with section 4-104 in ReWa's Procurement Code, ReWa advertised a Request for Proposal (RFP) in December 2022 from Construction Firms for the Construction Manager at Risk (CMAR) Services on the Swamp Rabbit Trail Phase 1 and 2 Improvement Project. Qualifications were received from five (5) Construction Firms for the project. The ReWa selection committee reviewed and scored the written qualifications that were received from each Firm's proposal against the scoring matrix provided in the RFP. The following three (3) Firms were the highest scoring Firms from the written RFP review and therefore were shortlisted for interview on the Project:

- Garney Companies, Inc.
- JDS, Inc.
- Reeves Young, LLC

Additional project specific information was requested of each shortlisted Firm and interviews were held with all three Firms on February 28, 2023. The ReWa selection committee reviewed the project specific information submitted by each of the Firms and scored each Firm's interview session against the scoring matrix provided in the RFP. Based upon the cumulative scores from both the Written RFP and the Interview portions of the selection process, staff has determined that Garney Companies, Inc. is the most qualified CMAR Firm to provide construction services for the Project.

Staff recommends that the Board award CMAR Pipeline Construction Services for the Swamp Rabbit Trail Phase 1 and 2 Improvement Project to Garney Companies, Inc. and authorize the Chief Executive Officer to execute CMAR Preconstruction Services for this project in the not to exceed amount of \$50,000.

Based upon the cumulative scores from both the Written RFP and the Interview portions of the selection process, staff has determined that Garney Companies, Inc. is the most qualified CMAR Firm to provide construction services for the Project.

FY22 Gravity Sewer Rehabilitation State Revolving Fund

WHEREAS, the State Water Quality Revolving Fund Authority (the "State Authority") provides low-interest loan financing for the construction of publicly-owned wastewater treatment facilities from the Water Pollution Control Revolving Fund (the "Fund") pursuant to the Federal Clean Water Act and Title 48, Chapter 5, Code of Laws of South Carolina 1976, as amended; and

WHEREAS, Renewable Water Resources ("ReWa") is a legally constituted special purpose district in the State of South Carolina and is authorized to incur revenue debt pursuant to Title 6, Chapter 17, Code of Laws of South Carolina 1976, as amended; and

WHEREAS, ReWa has determined that it is in its best interests to apply to the State Authority for a loan from the Fund;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Renewable Water Resources Commission (the "Commission"), the governing body of ReWa, in a meeting duly assembled:

1. That the Commission hereby authorizes the Chief Executive Officer to complete, and the Chairman of the Commission to execute and submit, an application to the State Authority for a loan from the Fund in the amount of approximately \$6,400,000.00 to finance the costs of rehabilitating sanitary sewers and manholes within ReWa's service area as further described in the application to the State Authority. The Chief Executive Officer is authorized to take such actions as may be necessary or convenient to complete the application process.

2. That ReWa will grant to the State Authority a pledge of and lien upon certain revenues of ReWa's sewer system for repayment of the loan.

3. That the final terms and conditions of the loan and the loan documents shall be subject to the approval of this Commission.

The above Resolution, upon motion duly made, was passed and approved by the Commission at their regular meeting held on the 20th day of March 2023.
